



## SERPPAS Focus Areas

- Three focus areas were identified as demonstration areas within the broader SERPPAS effort (see figure below): eastern North Carolina, South Carolina-MAJIC (i.e., Midlands Area Joint Installation Consortium), and FLAG (Florida, Alabama, Georgia) Corridor Partnership. Primary activities within these focus areas includes the sharing of GIS maps and identification of potential land uses (i.e., Strategic Lands Inventory, see project focus page), and development of partnership activities to leverage resources and promotes mutual and multiple benefits to SERPPAS partners.
- Eastern North Carolina* –Eastern North Carolina includes several military installations including Camp Lejeune, Cherry Point Marine Corp Air Station, New River Marine Corp Air Station, Fort Bragg, and Pope Air Force Base, to name a few. The State of North Carolina is committed to making the region more military friendly and in attracting more Defense associated activities. Some initial activities include the implementation of a state framework and newly formed Commander’s Council, which collectively provides an effective implementation platform for the SERPPAS model. As efforts within SERPPAS focus areas mature, key attributes to success will continue to be identified and tested.
- South Carolina-MAJIC* – The Midlands Area Joint Installation Consortium (MAJIC) is to facilitate a region-wide approach to compatible use of resources to strengthen military mission, community well-being, economic development, the environment and natural resources to reduce encroachment pressures. MAJIC includes five military installations: Fort Jackson, Shaw Air Force Base, Poinsett Range, McEntire Joint National Guard Base, and McCrady Training Center working with State and local non-governmental organizations to reduce development related pressures and leverage their presence in regional decision-making.
- FLAG Corridor Partnership* – The concept of a Florida-Alabama-Georgia (FLAG) Partnership originated at a meeting of federal agencies and state environmental/natural resources officials on 11 September 2007 at Fort Rucker. Participants at that meeting envisioned an alliance between multiple partners to conserve natural resources, promote compatible economic development, and sustain the operations of military bases in the region. Military installations of interest include Fort Rucker, Fort Benning, and Eglin Air Force Base. An *Ad-hoc FLAG Communication Committee* has been established to facilitate communication on issues and project updates as the partnership continues to mature.
