• Threatened, Endangered, and At-Risk Species

- ▶ (USFWS) The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service recently developed and released a story map that includes habitat suitability maps for the five longleaf pine habitat species (gopher tortoise, gopher frog, southern hognose snake, Florida pine snake, and striped newt). The map is interactive with many different data layers including species occurrences, USGS protected areas, sentinel landscapes, and NCED conservation easements. Thanks to a timely grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, ongoing work to help RCWs includes installing artificial nesting cavities, clearing storm debris, and resurveying RCW nest trees to create a new post-hurricane map of Silver Lake sites. ▶ (EO) A new Executive Order was issued on December 21, 2019, directing the USDA and DOI to implement policies to improve forest management practices by reducing hazardous fuel loads, mitigating fire risk and ensuring the safety and stability of local communities.
